This ensures that the website does not create a load on the device and that the website adjusts its speed based on the device on which it is being loaded.

Fitvids.js:

To put it simply, it is a daunting task to get an embedded video to resize itself when loading across different platforms. The ratio that works well with a computer screen may not work with a smartphone. Therefore, the Fitvids.js plugin ensures that you do not have to lift a finger as it resizes the video files depending on the device on which the website is being loaded.
